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Introduction

This plan is designed to guide decisions related to land use in the Town of Spruce Pine over the next 10-15 years. It serves to fulfill the requirement set by North Carolina General Statute Chapter 160D that local governments adopt a comprehensive plan as a prerequisite to exercising certain development regulations. To that end, the contents of this plan meet the standards for a comprehensive plan as set forth in N.C.G.S. 160D-501 (a-c).

This plan will take into account and build off of previous plans, including the Spruce Pine Downtown Master Plan, the Spruce Pine Downtown Implementation Plan, and the 2019 Mitchell County Comprehensive Transportation Plan. The bulk of the plan consists of background information related to land use issues in Spruce Pine. The reader can find information related to demographics, housing, transportation, environmental constraints, existing land use, parking, land use policies, parks and green space, and utilities.

The plan's development process included public input in the form of an online survey that was open to the public in October and November of 2022. A steering committee for the plan was assembled at the beginning of the process. This committee consisted of two Town staff members, two members of the Spruce Pine Main Street organization, one Mitchell County staff member, and the Town's Planning and Zoning board. Six meetings of this committee were held at Town hall to discuss goals and recommendations for the plan. These meetings were open to the public. The plan's recommendations are informed by the discussions in these meetings, the results of the public survey, and planning best practices.

A Note About Data Accuracy

A large portion of the background data in this plan is from US Census Bureau American Community Survey estimates. For communities with smaller populations such as Spruce Pine, this data often relies on higher margins of error. While it may not be 100% accurate, American Community Survey data is the most current and accessible for local statistics critical to planning topics and is useful in identifying trends.

Background Information

Population

Spruce Pine is an incorporated Town in Mitchell County, North Carolina. The Town has a population of 2,332 according to 2021 American Community Survey estimates. Spruce Pine and its surrounding areas are the most densely populated in Mitchell County.

The median age of Spruce Pine residents is 45.3 years. This is lower than the median age of the County but higher than that of the State, with median ages of 47.2 and 39.4, respectively. A breakdown of the Town's population by age shows that a majority of residents are between the ages of 25 and 64, with the largest age group being 45 to 54.

The populations of Towns in neighboring counties have varied greatly over the last decade. Spruce Pine's population has stayed relatively stagnant over this time period, with a decrease of only 1.38% since 2010. Population projections from the NC State Demographer's office for Mitchell County suggest that the overall county population will slowly decrease in coming decades as well. Mitchell County is seeing a negative natural increase in population, which is partially offset by in-migration to the County.

Economic Characteristics

Spruce Pine has a median household income (MHI) of \$44,375 as of 2021 American Community Survey estimates. This is lower than both the County and the State, with MHIs of \$48,320 and \$61,972, respectively. Spruce Pine's MHI has fluctuated greatly in recent years but has increased by almost 25% since 2011, from \$35,714 to its current median income. Towns in surrounding counties also have MHIs which differ greatly, but as of 2021, Spruce Pine's median income is similar to many of its neighboring towns.

Mitchell County has a full-time employed population of 4,513 according to 2021 American Community Survey estimates. Mitchell's overall workforce has stayed relatively stagnant since 2011, only marginally increasing since then. Industry employment numbers are consistent with these findings. Of the 13 census industry categories identified above, the County saw growth in six, while seeing a decline in the other seven. Most industries in the County saw only modest growth or decline in employment numbers. Notable growth occurred in information, professional, scientific, management, administrative, waste management, and other miscellaneous services. Transportation, warehousing, and utilities saw the most decline in employment.

Housing

Compared with Mitchell County, Spruce Pine has a higher rate of renter-occupied housing. 33.5% of housing in Spruce Pine is rented compared to only 21.5% in the County. Renters tend to be more cost-burdened than homeowners, making a high percentage of renters have a potential housing affordability issue. It is generally accepted that those spending more than 30% of their monthly income on housing are cost burdened. In Spruce Pine, 39.8% of renters in Town pay 30% or more of their monthly income towards rent compared to only 17.2% of homeowners. Of those cost-burdened renters, a majority are spending more than 35% of their monthly income on rent. Despite these numbers, gross rent has stayed relatively affordable in Spruce Pine since 2011. Median gross rent in Spruce Pine is \$621, a lower figure than the County and the State. According to rent inflation statistics, the average rent increase in North Carolina since 2000 has been 3.58% per year. Spruce Pine's median gross rent in 2011 was \$510, meaning that the expected gross rent in 2021 would be \$725, well above the \$621 figure.

Transportation

Roads

Land use, development patterns, and transportation systems are interconnected. For example, communities with a high concentration of industrial uses often require multilane highways and access to rail. Communities with a compact or pre-WWII development pattern tend to feature a greater emphasis on multi-modal forms of travel such as walking or biking. Communities and neighborhoods with large lot sizes, suburbanstyle development patterns, and infrequent transit service force, by their design, residents to rely on access to an automobile to fulfill everyday needs.

Driving is the primary mode of transportation in Spruce Pine. US Highway 19E and NC Highway 226 converge near the center of Town and are the two most traveled roadways in Town. Though US 19E is the most traveled roadway in Town limits, it contains relatively few businesses. Most of the land bordering US 19E in Spruce Pine is zoned residential.

Maintenance of roadways in North Carolina is the responsibility of the North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT), municipalities, or private property owners, depending on location and ownership. Each year, towns and cities submit a map to the State delineating maintenance responsibility for the streets within their jurisdiction in order to secure Powell Bill funds. These funds are derived from fuel tax collections and are distributed by the State of North Carolina to local governments based on the length of public roadways they maintain. Spruce Pine is responsible for maintaining 24.19 miles of roads in Town limits and is receiving \$88,452.43 in Powell Bill funds for FY 2022/2023.

Mitchell County updated their Comprehensive Transportation Plan in 2019. Recommended improvements from the plan included a majority of Spruce Pine's main roads. Notably, U.S. 19E was identified as being in need of widening improvements from east Spruce Pine to Avery County. The plan also recommends converting the current multi-lane section through Spruce Pine by adding bicycle and pedestrian accommodations. Other roadways in Town were identified as needing minor widening improvements. These include NC 226, Altapass Highway, Roan Road, Beaver Creek Road, and Sullins Branch Road. It is recommended that these roads be widened for modernization improvements to 10-12 foot lanes with a minimum 4-6 foot shoulder.

Public Transit

The Mitchell County Transportation Authority operates a free public transit service called The Pine Line. The Pine Line is an ADA accessible shuttle that makes ten stops in and around the Town of Spruce Pine. The shuttle operates every weekday between the hours of 6 am and 6 pm. Most respondents to the public survey had never used the Pine Line personally, however over 70% were in favor of its continued operation.

Pedestrian Facilities

The 2019 Mitchell County Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP) took an inventory of all sidewalks in Town limits. The plan recommended sidewalk additions or improvements along almost all of Spruce Pine's main roads. Additionally, a multi-use path is recommended along NC 226 from the Blue Ridge Parkway to Summit Avenue, and from Riverside Park, following the North Toe River and Creed Pittman Road. A map from the CTP showing existing facilities as well as recommended improvements is shown on the following page.

Parking

Spruce Pine has two public parking lots downtown, both located off of Locust Street. Together, these lots have space for 63 cars. Additionally, public parking spots exist along Locust Street and Oak Avenue. All public parking is free of charge. Respondents to the public survey were not in favor of introducing parking fees to public lots.

Parks and Green Space

The Town of Spruce Pine has two public parks, Riverside Park and Brad Ragan Park. Plans for a third park, Stroup Road Park, are underway.

Riverside Park is located near downtown and is adjacent to the North Toe River. A large footbridge crosses the North Toe River and connects the park with downtown. Facilities at Riverside Park include a baseball field, a playground, picnic shelters, community gardens, restrooms, a splash pad, and an amphitheater, and a 0.47-mile paved walking trail.

Brad Ragan Park is located in a residential area in the southwest corner of Town. Facilities at Brad Ragan Park include a swimming pool, a sand volleyball court, a T-ball field, tennis courts, basketball courts, pickleball courts, adult fitness equipment, a pump track, two playgrounds, four picnic shelters, and restroom facilities.





The Town currently owns an undeveloped property along the North Toe River with plans for the property to become Stroup Road Park in the near future. The Town would like for the park to be a river-focused recreation area, with a possible facilities including a fishing pier, river boat/raft access, picnic tables, and parking.

Utilities

Water and wastewater service are provided by the Town of Spruce Pine to its residents. The Town's water system consists of an estimated 59 miles of distribution lines, serving 2,171 metered connections as of 2021. No industrial or institutional connections were identified on the Town's latest water supply plan due to the Town applying the same rate to all non-residential users. However, several large industrial and institutional users are present in Spruce Pine. Two correctional institutions as well as two industrial mining operations are supplied water by the Town. These uses account for large shares of overall system use.

The Town's 2021 NCDEQ Local Water Supply Plan identifies the water system's storage capacity at 1,743,000 gallons. The plan also showed average daily uses ranging from 1,163,200 gallons in July to 1,246,000 gallons in October. This shows that the Town's water system is operating at a maximum of 71.5% capacity, indicating some room for growth.

The Town has one wastewater treatment plan, with a permitted capacity of 2 million gallons/day. The average annual daily discharge of the plant is 618,500 gallons.

Electrical service in Spruce Pine is provided largely by Duke Energy. Natural gas is provided by Piedmont Natural Gas. Fiber and telecommunications are provided by Zito Media.

Environmental Constraints

Environmental features such as steep slope, flood zones, streams, and wetlands can have a significant effect on development patterns. Steep slopes and flood zones can prevent construction or make it impractical. Regulations surrounding wetlands can dictate the extent and type of development in their vicinity.

These features are present throughout the Town of Spruce Pine, but fluctuate in their location and intensity. Steep slopes are typically defined as any slope 25% or greater. In Spruce Pine, slopes fitting this description are prominent in the Town's northern and eastern areas, but are less so in the southern portions of Town and the downtown area. The areas with steep slopes present are largely undeveloped. Flood zones in Spruce Pine coincide with the North Toe River, which runs through the Town from southeast to

northwest, as well as Beaver Creek and Grassy Creek, which branch out from the North Toe River. Flood zones along these waters are prominent but have not entirely prevented development.

The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality classifies streams and sets restrictions on activities in the watershed. Both the North Toe River, Beaver Creek, and Grassy Creek are classified as C; Tr streams. Class C streams are "Waters protected for uses such as aquatic life propagation, survival and maintenance of biological integrity, wildlife, secondary contact recreation, and agriculture. Secondary contact recreation means wading, boating, other uses not involving human body contact with water, and activities involving human body contact with water where such activities take place on an infrequent, unorganized, or incidental basis." The Tr added on to this is a supplemental classification, "intended to protect freshwaters that have conditions that sustain and allow for natural trout propagation and survival and for year-round maintenance of stocked trout."

Wetlands are also present in Spruce Pine, and largely coincide with the previously mentioned rivers and streams. Maps of all of these environmental features can be found on the following pages.









Development Regulations

Spruce Pine has a zoning ordinance as well as a zoning map intended to regulate land use and development within Town limits. Land use in town is divided into twelve districts, each with a stated purpose, permitted uses, and special uses. These districts include R-1 Low-Density Residential, R-2 Medium-Density Residential, R-3 High-Density Residential, T-1 Trailer and Trailer Park, C-1 Primary Business, C-2 Neighborhood Business, C-3 Highway-Business, C-1A Central Business Fringe, PS-1 Public Service, I-1 Industrial (light), I-2 Industrial (heavy), and M-1 Medical Arts. The ordinance also contains a number of general provisions, including nonconforming uses, off-street parking requirements, offstreet loading and unloading space, required street access, lot dimensions, and setback requirements.

In addition to the zoning ordinance, the Town has a variety of ordinances compiled into a document titled "Spruce Pine Town Code". This document includes many different provisions and regulations on an array of topics including but not limited to administration, elections, emergencies, garbage and refuse, motor vehicles and traffic, housing, nuisances, and offenses. A table of contents for this code can be found in Appendix II.

The Town is currently in the process of updating these ordinances and putting them into a more user-friendly digital format. This will include the zoning ordinance. All of the Town's ordinances exist only as photocopies, making them difficult to navigate and amend. That ordinance update process, though already underway, is included as a recommendation of this plan.



Existing Land Use

The planning process included a survey existing land use, performed by driving all Town roads and designating each parcel with a land use classification. There were 15 possible classifications.

Of the 15 possible classifications, Single-Family residential, industrial, and vacant properties accounted for the highest percentages of property by acreage. Commercial uses also made up a relatively large share of property. Vacant lots in Town account for the most overall land area. These lots are spread throughout Town but are particularly prominent in the Town's outer areas and areas with steeper slopes. A majority of the vacant property in Town consists of larger lots. A map showing the results of the land use study can be found on the following page.



Public Input

Public input for this plan was gathered in the form of an online public survey. The survey was posted to the Town's website and facebook page, and was advertised via the local newspaper. Hard copies of the survey were made available at Town Hall. The survey received 369 responses in October and November of 2022. A summary of the results is shown below.

Limited Choice Questions

- Over half of respondents to the survey did not live in Spruce Pine, but almost 50% those who did had been residents for 10+ years.
- The largest age group of respondents was 60-69, accounting for almost a quarter of all responses. The 50-59 and 40-49 age groups also accounted for large percentages of responses, with 22.55% and 19.29% respectively.

- Over half of respondents rated the exterior appearance of commercial buildings as fair or poor. Only 16.26% rated them as good or very good.
- Almost 70% of respondents indicated Spruce Pine does not have enough recreational opportunities.
- Over 90% of respondents had never used the Pine Line, but over 70% would like to see it continue to operate.

- Respondents indicated that they were heavily opposed to metered parking or parking fees for public lots.
- Over 70% of respondents were in favor of raising property maintenance standards for commercial uses in Town.
- One question gave respondents a list of residential uses and asked them to what degree they would like to encourage or discourage each use. Those uses that received favorable responses include:
 - Single-Family Homes
 - o Townhomes
 - o Duplexes
 - o Small-scale multi-family housing
 - Downtown housing



- A similar question gave respondents a list of common issues relating to land use and asked them to indicate to what degree the town should prioritize them. Issues that received particularly high emphasis include:
 - Building and property upkeep
 - Stormwater and flooding of streets/yards
 - Walkability
 - Improving recreational opportunities
 - Improving/maintaining the downtown streetscape
 - Preserving small town environment/image

Open Response Questions

The survey also contained 11 open response questions, which allowed respondents to voice specific concerns about certain topics. A summary of these responses is shown below.

A majority of respondents voiced a need for additional recreation opportunities in Town. Popular responses included:

- Bowling
- More for Teens/Children
- Trails
- Indoor Recreation
- Recreation utilizing the river
- Skating
- Dog Parks

176 respondents identified roadway safety concerns and 140 identified pedestrian safety concerns. Commonly cited areas where roadway safety could be improved included:

- The connection of Oak Avenue and Locust Street downtown.
- The intersection of Summit Avenue and Highway 226
- The intersection of Altapass Highway and Highway 19E
- Parts of Greenwood Road
- Parts of Beaver Creek Road

Commonly cited pedestrian safety concerns included:

- Along Greenwood Road from Ingles to Highway 19E
- Along Oak Avenue, from downtown to the 50s Diner
- Along all of Highway 226 and Highway 19E
- Along Summit Avenue

Two questions asked respondents to identify land use changes that have had a positive impact on Spruce Pine, and those that have had a negative impact. For negative impacts, the overwhelming response was in regard to vacant and dilapidated buildings and properties throughout Town. This is consistent with discussions among the plan steering committee, who also identified this as a critical issue. Common responses for positive impacts included:

- Riverside Park
- Changes to Locust Street downtown
- New businesses downtown and elsewhere in Town

Recommendations

Based on monthly meetings with the plan's steering committee as well as the results of the public survey, the following list of recommendations has been compiled.

- 1. Designate "Spruce Pine Main Street" as an overlay district on the Town's zoning map.
 - a. Spruce Pine Main Street is an organization dedicated to "fostering and promoting economic and cultural viability" in Spruce Pine's downtown area. The organization has designated boundaries that they serve within Spruce Pine. This district was determined to be suitable for the following recommendation regarding vacant buildings, but does not currently exist on the Town's zoning map. Spruce Pine Main Street should be designated as an overlay district with the following recommendation in mind.
- 2. Develop a vacant building ordinance to apply to all property in the Spruce Pine Main Street District.
 - a. Discussions with the plan's steering committee as well as results of the public survey indicated that many Town residents are concerned with the state of some vacant and blighted commercial properties, particularly in or near the downtown area. The Town currently has no means to address such properties in their ordinance.
 - b. Taking this into account, it is recommended that the Town develop an ordinance to address vacant and/or dilapidated properties, to include the following:
 - i. A statement of purpose and intent
 - ii. Definitions for vacant buildings and blighted/afflicted properties
 - iii. Provisions against creating or maintaining such properties
 - iv. Enforcement and penalties
- 3. Develop a permitting process and standards for demolition.
 - a. In an effort to control the prevalence of the previously mentioned blighted properties in Town, it is recommended that the Town develop procedures for demolition. A permitting process for demolition will allow the Town to set standards for how these projects are carried out. Such a process should include:
 - i. Debris removal requirements

- ii. Utility disconnection
- iii. Timeframes and inspection requirements
- iv. Certification of asbestos abatement
- v. Intended use of property after demolition
- vi. Bonds and/or penalties for violation
- b. For enforcement purposes, it is recommended the Town develop these procedures in conjunction with Mitchell County, if possible.
- 4. Permit mixed use developments in all Town business districts.
 - a. Through meetings of the plan's steering committee, it was determined that more mixed-use development in Town would be beneficial for future growth. "Mixed uses" are buildings which include both residential and commercial space, usually with commercial on the first floor at street level, and residential above. This type of development is not currently addressed in the Town's zoning ordinance. It is recommended that the Town define mixed use developments in their zoning ordinance and permit them in business districts.
 - b. This recommendation is consistent with a recommendation from the Downtown Spruce Pine Master Plan, which stated that mixed use developments should be allowed in the Town's Central Business and Central Business Fringe districts.
- 5. Develop a sign ordinance with a permitting process.
 - The Town of Spruce Pine currently has minimal regulations addressing signage. This is a standard feature of most municipal zoning ordinances. The Town should develop a sign ordinance which addresses the following:
 - i. Definitions
 - ii. Permitted signs
 - iii. Prohibited signs
 - iv. Sign dimensions
 - v. Obsolete and abandoned signs
 - vi. Maintenance standards
 - vii. Exempt Signs
 - viii. A permitting process

- 6. Explore additional funding sources to maintain operation of the Pine Line.
 - a. The Pine Line is a bus route operated by Mitchell County in and around the Town of Spruce Pine. While the Town currently does not have a hand in the operation of the Pine Line, both survey respondents and the plan's steering committee expressed a desire to see this service continue. The Town should pursue means to contribute to funding of the Pine Line.
- 7. Develop minimum appearance standards for business districts.
 - a. The Town's zoning ordinance currently contains no standards for appearance in commercial districts. Responses to the public survey as well as discussion amongst the plan's steering committee revealed that many Town residents are concerned about the overall appearance of the Town's commercial areas. Taking this into account, it is recommended that the Town develop minimum standards for appearance to apply to all properties in commercial districts. The Town should create sections in the zoning ordinance to address the following:
 - i. Outdoor storage screening requirements
 - Many municipalities require uses in commercial districts to screen any items which must be stored outdoors. This commonly includes equipment, machinery, building supplies, or any other items relating to regular business operation. Standards for outdoor storage screening should address methods of screening (fence, wall, evergreen vegetation, etc.) as well as proper height.
 - ii. Street and parking lot yard requirements for new development or renovation
 - 1. Requiring new development to provide a certain amount of green space ensures that these spaces are preserved in commercial districts. A common method of accomplishing this is through the requirement of street and parking lot yards. Parking lot yards require that a minimum area of parking lots be landscaped planting areas. Specific requirements vary, but typically include a percentage of area to be landscaped, minimum square footage of landscaped areas, and amount, height, and type of trees and shrubs required.

- 2. Street yards are strips of land containing landscaped materials along public streets. Similar to parking lot yards, requirements for street yards typically include amount, height, and types of trees and shrubbery to be used.
- iii. Sidewalk construction requirements for new development or renovation.
 - 1. A need for more sidewalks and better connectivity was expressed by respondents to the public survey. In order to strengthen the Town's pedestrian network, it is recommended that sidewalk construction be required along road frontage for all new commercial and multi-family development. Such sidewalks located along a public street or right-of-way should require dedication to the Town upon completion.
- iv. Vegetative buffer requirements where commercial property abuts residential property.
 - 1. In order to preserve the integrity of surrounding residential districts while still encouraging growth in commercial districts, it is recommended that the Town require vegetative buffers where non-residential development abuts a residential district. These buffers will serve as a visual separation between residential and non-residential uses and ensure the latter do not encroach on the former. These requirements should address height and width, as well as types of trees and shrubbery to be used.
- v. Landscaping plans for new development or renovation.
 - If a development is subject to any of the landscaping requirements identified above, it should be required to submit a landscaping plan to the Town. Such a plan should consist of locations, species, and height of new trees and shrubbery, location and dimensions of planting areas, dimensions of parking and paved areas, and the location and height of walls and fences.
- 8. Add regulations to the zoning ordinance to address Tiny Homes.
 - a. The plan's steering committee as well as Town staff believe that it would be prudent to address Tiny Homes in the Town's zoning ordinance. These residential uses are becoming increasingly popular in the region, and the Town currently has no means to address them. This can either be accomplished by adopting the state's regulations on Tiny Homes in appendix Q of the NC Residential Building Code or by creating a separate set of regulations specifically tailored to the needs and wishes of the Town.
 - b. If created by the Town, regulations for Tiny Homes should include:
 - i. Standards and definitions, distinguishing between different types of tiny homes (manufactured, movable, site-built, etc.)
 - ii. Dimensional requirements
 - iii. Permitted districts for Tiny Home development
 - c. Town specific regulations for Tiny Homes can be more restrictive than Appendix Q of the residential code, but not less.
- 9. Review the C-3 Highway Business district to determine its effectiveness.
 - a. In the course of the planning process, it was determined that the C-3 Highway Business district may be outdated and not serving the Town's current needs and goals. Certain areas of this district, or the district as a whole, may be benefit from being rezoned. To determine the extent and necessity of changes to this district, the Town should conduct a thorough review of its current state.
- 10. Develop a plan and pursue funding for a greenway along the North Toe River beginning at Riverside Park.
 - a. The idea of a greenway along the North Toe River has been discussed in Spruce Pine and Mitchell County for many years, but no formal plans have ever brought the idea to fruition. Due to the identified need in the public survey for more recreation, specifically more trails and recreation utilizing the river, it is recommended that the Town begin a formal planning effort to make this project a reality.

- 11. Expand the definitions section of the zoning ordinance and include definitions for manufactured homes.
 - a. The definitions section of the Town's zoning ordinance is currently sparse and does not contain enough definitions to adequately address the entire contents of the ordinance. Manufactured homes were specifically identified as needing additional clarity, but the Town should conduct a full review of its zoning ordinance to ensure that all terms are properly defined.
- 12. Update the layout of all Town ordinances and publish them online.
 - a. The Spruce Pine Town Code, previously mentioned in the Development Regulations section of this document, is the Town's code of ordinances. It contains the zoning ordinance and a variety of other regulations. These ordinances exist as dated photocopies, making them difficult to decipher, navigate, and edit if needed. The Town has begun the process of updating the layout of these ordinances and should continue until the entire code exists in an easily accessible and user-friendly format.
- 13. Add down lighting requirements for new development and encourage a transition to down lighting for lights that already exist.
 - a. An observatory exists in Mitchell County in close proximity to the Town of Spruce Pine. This observatory is a unique and important asset for the County. In order to minimize the effects of light pollution and preserve the dark sky for this observatory into the future, it is recommended that the Town require down lighting for all new development and renovation in commercial and industrial districts.
 - b. Additionally, the Town should encourage existing lighting that does not minimize light pollution to transition to down lighting and ensure that all holiday and decorative lighting is kept to a minimum and promptly removed once the season is over.

14. Offer free WiFi downtown.

a. In order to foster growth and enhance the downtown experience for residents and visitors, the Town should pursue means to offer free public WiFi in the downtown area.

- 15. Pursue funding for an inventory and assessment of the Town's water and wastewater systems.
 - a. To ensure that all necessary improvements for water and wastewater systems are identified, the Town should pursue funds for an inventory and assessment of both systems.
 - b. The assessment should also include development of a capital improvement plan for the Town's water and wastewater systems.
- 16. Continue to pursue funding opportunities for updates to water and wastewater infrastructure.
 - a. The Town has pursued various avenues of funding for water and wastewater infrastructure improvements in recent years. This should be a continual process, to ensure all necessary improvements are made.
- 17. Continue to work with the County and the State to implement improvements from Mitchell County's Comprehensive Transportation Plan.
 - a. Mitchell County's Comprehensive Transportation was updated in 2019. Recommended improvements from that plan in Spruce Pine are outlined in the transportation section of this plan. The Town was a part of the CTP plan development process, and should continue to work with leaders at the County and State level to ensure that needed transportation improvements are implemented.
- 18. Continue to ensure that all Town ordinances are in compliance with North Carolina law.
 - a. While a goal of this plan is to satisfy updated requirements from NC General Statute 160D, the Town should continue to ensure that all of its ordinances and policies are in compliance with North Carolina law. In order to accomplish this, all Town policies should be reviewed on a regular basis and updated as needed.
